 - Teams and Draw:
 - Joe: We really want six teams. Whether we've got 5 or 6 teams, we'll have long games (see below) but if teams have a bye then it could be a really long break for some teams. Assuming we get at least 54 registrations, would we prefer 6 teams of 9? Or 5 teams of 11? We (as in, you guys at the meeting) need to choose a cutoff for when we go to six teams. It makes no difference from a t-shirt perspective (we have 12 of each shirt), but we need to consider it for the draw. Although a five-team-draw would have the same number of games as a six-team-draw, we can afford to have longer games with smaller breaks in between if we have teams of 11 AND a bye. It's up to you. (50 4 teams) (need 55 5 teams) (66 6 teams cap)
 - The Draw
 - Joe: I'm happy to do the draw. Whether we have five or six teams, there'll need to be five rounds of round-robin (assuming we want each team to play each other. The best balance for this is for four round-robin games to be on the first day, followed by one game Sunday morning then two rounds of finals. However, if we wanted a less stressful start on Saturday (I remember someone calling for this) then it's quite manageable to have three games on the first day then two rounds followed by up to two finals on Sunday. Discuss and decide.
 - Personally, I think the first option would be better, but there are problems if we have only five teams. With five teams, the one that

finishes fifth won't be in the finals at all. They'll sit out a long and boring afternoon. If that team happened to be the one with the bye first thing on Sunday, then that team won't play any game, at all, on Sunday. This is a big reason why I think we need 6 teams of 9.
